Corpus Christi H.O.G. Mileage Contest

The 2nd Quarter Jim Clark Memorial Mileage Contest had 12 members turn in their mileage and was won by Rickey & Connie Thielen with 14,354 miles. Rickey & Connie were presented with the 2nd quarter patch and will receive a tee shirt from Preston Douglass and CCHD. The runners up were Sabas Cavazos with 12,274 miles, Louis Kubala with 11,981 miles, Bryan & Sherrie Gabbert with 7,345 miles, John Fitzgerald with 4,296 miles, Richard Smith with 3,506 miles, Eric Thomas with 2,221 miles, Marshall Lester with 2,160 miles, John & Julie Lackey with 1,904 miles, Cyndi Robinson with 1,520 miles, David Benoist with 1,499 miles, and Dan Robinson with 974 miles. Total mileage accumulated by our members for the 2nd quarter was 64,034 miles.

Richard Smith won the consolation drawing for the runners up and received a shirt from Preston Douglass and CCHD.

There are two ways to win each quarter. One way is to have the highest outright mileage for the quarter. The other way is to win the runners up consolation drawing from the remaining eligible participants for the quarter. Those who have won in either category during the course of the year are not eligible to win again in that category for the remainder of the year.

Thanks to all who participated and congratulations to Rickey & Connie Thielen for their high mileage for the 2nd quarter and to Richard Smith as the consolation drawing winner.

Pikes Peak H.O.G. Chapter 18th Annual 5 in 1 Ride

John & Julie Lackey and Rickey & Connie Thielen rode to Colorado Springs, Colorado each taking different routes, departure dates and times to ride in the 18th Annual 5-IN-1 High Altitude Poker Run with the Pikes Peak H.O.G. Chapter. Riders gathered at Pikes Peak Harley-Davidson on the afternoon of July 14, 2017 to check in, get their packet/merchandise and riding directions for the ride that was to take place the next morning on July 15. Burgers and chips were also served for those that wanted to brave the rain downpour that was common for the afternoons this week.

It's was before daybreak, our Harley's headlights were illuminating the empty interstate and city's lights twinkled in the valley. The craggy outlines of Colorado's Front Range cut like a jigsaw puzzle through the night sky. Sunrise is a little more than an hour away, but the parking lot of Pikes Peak Harley-Davidson was already bustling with activity. Arriving in the parking lot around 5:20 AM, on July 15th, there were lots of bikes already there. We were lined up behind the Road Captain in Group #4 to be led by Pikes Peaks H.O.G. Chapter Road Captain Eric Merrell. We were looking forward to taking off on a ride that would be forever in our memory – *Continued on Page 3*

feasting our senses on waterfalls, switchbacks with sheer drops, and frontier towns in no hurry to leave the 19th century. Our group left at about 6:15 AM as the first three groups were being spaced out with the 1st leaving at 5:30 AM. As we rode through the Rockies, we would find some of the most challenging and rewarding terrains for motorcycles with the goal of riding over **FIVE** 10,000 foot mountain passes in one day.

Squaw Pass and Juniper Pass are actually north-south passes that you cross from east to west at elevations of 11,020 feet. So, why does that matter? Well, it's because as you "cross" these passes going west, there is no descent...only one long continuous climb. You are riding along the ridge line of a few mountains rather than over them.

Guanella Pass, while a detour from Hwy 285, provided a perfect snapshot of the Rocky Mountain ecosystem in only 22 short miles and has an elevation of 11,669 feet. Animal life is plentiful throughout the area, with bighorn sheep and the occasional beaver making frequent appearances.

Hoosier Pass is located on the Continental Divide at the northern end of the Mosquito Range, in a gap between Mount Lincoln (west) and Hoosier Ridge (east) and has an elevation of 11,542. It sits on the boundary between Park (south) and Summit (north) counties.

Kenosha Pass is located in the Rocky Mountains, just northeast of the town of Fairplay, Colorado and has an elevation of 10,001 feet. Geologically, the pass is located atop a large granite batholith (known as the Kenosha Batholith) that forms the spine of the Front Range along the eastern side of South Park.

Monarch Pass is located on the Continental Divide at the southern end of the Wasatch Range along the border between Gunnison and Chaffee counties, approximately 25 miles (40 km) west of the town of Salida and has an elevation of 11,312 feet. The pass carries U.S. Highway 50 over the Sawatch Range, providing a route between Tomichi Creek in the upper basin of the Gunnison River on the west and the South Arkansas River, a tributary of the Arkansas River, on the east.

It was a memorable ride that lasted all day and covered about 300 miles. We ended up in Salida, Colorado at around 4:00 PM for the evening and settled in at our motel. The Wallbanger's Restaurant was the location of the closing festivities that evening where drawings for prizes, the poker hand results and the group picture was taken along with dinner.

On the morning of July 16th John & Julie headed west to Moab, Utah for an evening ride down the Colorado River before heading home via Four Corners ending up covering 3,207 miles, 5 states over 7 days. Rickey & Connie headed north to the Sturgis, South Dakota area to ride the Black Hills before heading home ending up covering 4,135 miles, 7 states over 10 days.

Anyone up for the 19th annual ride next year?











H.O.G. National Rally

After an absence of eight years, H.O.G. put on their first U.S. National Rally. In 2009 the rally was held in Oklahoma City, OK. and eight members of the Corpus Christi H.O.G. Chapter attended. This year's rally was held in Milwaukee, WI. from August 30 through September 2 at the Harley-Davidson Museum on Canal Street.

Those that attended were part of H.O.G. history in 2017 as the National Rally returned this year to Harley-Davidson's hometown of Milwaukee, Wisconsin August 30th – September 2nd. Attendees felt a rumble deep in their soul that said they were home the moment they arrived at the rally's headquarters, the iconic Harley-Davidson Museum, where they connected to Harley-Davidson's shared history through the motorcycles, exhibits, and stories of generations of riders just like you. The rally partnered with the Full Throttle Saloon to bring Throttlefest to Harley-Davidson's Hometown. Throttlefest featured FIVE days of music, motorcycles and more! Jackyl, The Kenny Wayne Shepherd Band, The Dead Daisies, Hairball, Circus Una's High-Wire Motorcycle Thrill Show, Rhett Rotten's Wall of Death, food trucks, artisans and a whole lot more provided the entertainment. Thousands of riders showed up for some great rides through the beautiful hills and rock formations of Wisconsin's Kettle Moraine, rode down the Wisconsin River, or zig-zagged along quiet farm roads up to Green Bay to visit the football holy land at the Packers' Lambeau field. In addition to the action at the Museum, H.O.G. partnered with the annual Milwaukee Rally so attendees could enjoy festivities at all of the Milwaukee-area Harley-Davidson dealers.

Unfortunately for those from our area, we had to deal with Hurricane Harvey or we would have had some members participate. There is always the 115th Harley-Davidson Motor Company Anniversary next year to look forward to!

Your 2017 "Green" card is still valid until December 31, 2017, but on January 1, 2018 your Rider Reward percentage will go back to the minimum until you get your five events in.

As if just riding with our great chapter was not reward enough, this is even one more incentive to get out and ride. Plus if you renew by January 1, you save four bucks on your renewal. Renewals paid before January 1 are only \$20.00! All memberships (both old member renewal and new members) paid January 1 and after are \$24.00. New members get a special bonus! If you join in October, November or December; your membership is good through the rest of 2017 and all of 2018!

Riding with Passengers

Traveling with a passenger is a task best left to the experienced motorcycle operator because it affects many different aspects of your bike's operation. Carrying a passenger on the back of your bike is quite different than transporting a heavy bag or other cargo. You should spend some time practicing your skills in a low-traffic area before carrying a passenger on a busy street, if you are new to riding.

Always follow the state's DMV regulations for carrying a passenger on your motorcycle. You can learn about these laws in the motorcycle operator manual or contact your nearest driver license office with questions.

Preparing your bike for a passenger is important. Not all motorcycles are equipped to carry a passenger. If you want to invite a guest on your trip, you will need a seat big enough to carry two people and extra foot pegs for your passenger. Of course, an extra helmet is also a necessity. Your owner's manual can also provide information about the weight limitations, operational recommendations, and equipment setup. In addition, it will tell you whether your suspension and tire pressure should be adjusted. Many states have specific equipment guidelines that your motorcycle must meet if you wish to carry a passenger. For example, it's common for the DMV to require your motorcycle to have passenger footrests and a separate seating area for the passenger. Do not carry passengers on your bike until you are certain you can comply with these requirements.

Safety tips for carrying a passenger should be carefully considered. Before you carry a passenger, give them a quick safety lesson. If this is a new rider, don't assume that your passenger understands what they must do. The following tips will help keep your passenger safe:

- They must be tall enough to reach the footrests.
- They must keep their feet on the footrests at all times.
- They should keep their legs away from the mufflers, since they can get very hot.
- They must wear a helmet and other protective gear.
- They must not turn or make sudden moves that could affect your ability to safely control the motorcycle.
- They must hold onto your waist or the bike's passenger handholds.

When carrying a passenger, they should be considered to be a second operator. Don't allow someone on your bike who doesn't obey your safety instructions. Children should not be carried without the permission of a parent or legal guardian. Riding a motorcycle poses a safety risk and they should have the appropriate protective gear. Some states have legal requirements for the minimum age of a passenger on a motorcycle. If you have someone who frequently travels with you, ask them to complete a basic safety course. Even if they never learn to operate a motorcycle, this course will provide a better understanding of the procedures to avoid accidents while you are riding together.

Riding safely while carrying passengers will require you to make some adjustments to your riding style. A passenger's extra weight will substantially affect your bike's handling characteristics. To help compensate for this difference, please remember:

- Allow more time and space for passing.
- Be cautious when turning corners since clearance may be affected.
- The extra weight of your passenger will increase the stopping power of your rear brake.
- You will need greater clutch finesse and more throttle when starting from a stop.
- With the added weight it will take longer to turn, slow down, or speed up on your motorcycle.
- Avoid traveling at extreme speeds.
- Be prepared to counter the effects of wind when appropriate.

When traveling with a passenger, remember to start the bike before your passenger mounts the bike. The kick stand should be raised and the bike should be securely braced before the passenger mounts the motorcycle.
