### **SAFETY CORNER**

I have categorized our safety program in three areas or topic groups. Group 1 is the motorcycle itself. Group 2 is the rider and passenger. Group 3 is the ride. I covered Group 1 last issue. So this time I want to cover safety issues regarding the rider and any passenger.

- 1. Personal Safety Gear Wearing all your personal riding safety gear is highly recommended to help ensure every ride is a fun and safe one. Recommended gear includes: (a) Motorcycle Helmet – All helmets should be certified to meet Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard No. 218, (D.O.T. certified). They should fit snug and should be worn properly with strap fastened under the chin. (b) Eye Protection – Motorcycle Eye protection should be designed to meet or exceed American National Standards Institute standards for impact and shatter resistance. These include goggles, wraparound glasses, or a full-face shield (properly attached to a helmet). A windshield or fairing does not constitute proper eye protection. (c) Foot Protection – Proper foot protection includes sturdy over-the-ankle footwear that affords protection for the feet and ankles (durable leather or ballistic-type cloth athletic shoes that cover the ankles may be worn). (d) Protective Clothing - Protective clothing should include long-sleeved shirt or jacket, long trousers, and full-fingered gloves made from leather or other abrasion-resistant material. Some may question wearing long-sleeved shirts in the summer thinking it would be too hot. But in actuality, the evaporation from perspiration will keep you cooler, as well as protecting you from potential sunburn. Motorcycle jackets and pants constructed of abrasion-resistant materials such as leather, Kevlar®, or Cordura® and containing impact-absorbing padding are strongly encouraged. These will significantly protect the rider in the case of going down. Many light weight and vented styles are available for summer use. NOTE: Riders are encouraged to select gear that incorporates fluorescent colors and/or retroreflective material to improve visibility to others.
- 2. Rest Proper rest is very important for a safe ride. Try to get a good night's sleep prior to a ride, particularly a long ride.
- 3. Hydrated I can't overstate the importance of being properly hydrated prior to going on a ride, especially during the summer. Hydration should start the night before the ride, and continue during the ride by drinking water at each stop on a long ride.

# **South Carolina HOG Rally**

This year's South Carolina H.O.G. Rally billed itself as the High Voltage Rally - Thunder Rolls into the Electric City of Anderson. The organizers gave its attendees every opportunity to ride the great roads and see the beautiful spring colors of the upstate of South Carolina, western North Carolina, and northeast Georgia. They obviously love their part of the country for many reasons and is an area that they ride the amazing roads all year round. No small part of the appeal was their southern hospitality that is such a part of their heritage. They

invited all to feel right at home and did their best to serve up a good old down home welcome.

The rally had three full days of activities starting on Thursday April 21<sup>st</sup>. The host hotel and registration location was the Holiday Inn with Timms Harley-Davidson set up as another area for some of the guided rides. Activities included a Passport Tour involving riding to twenty area businesses, including the H-D of Greenville, to get a stamp or signature for a chance at a drawing during the closing ceremonies. The rally Dealer Receipt Tour was one that had involved going to as many of the state H-D dealers as possible in previous couple months before the rally for chances at a drawing. The Harley-Davidson demo ride trailer was set up at the Holiday Inn for members that wanted to test ride different bikes. There were self-guided rides mapped out for those that wanted to explore on their own and guided rides that included Sassafras/Pretty Place and Campbell's Bridge. The opening ceremonies that evening were held at the Darwin Wright Park with a rally party following at Timms Harley-Davidson.

Friday morning started off bright an early with a Sunrise guided ride followed by registration. The morning guided rides went to the Georgia Guide Stones and a guided Passport Ride. That afternoon at the Holiday Inn the Anderson Police Department along with a group from the Atlanta PD had a K-9 demonstration. These animals are dedicated to their handlers and the handlers are in turn dedicated to their animals. After several animals were shown they challenged the crowd to see if anyone wanted to volunteer to suit up in the padded jumpsuit to test one of the dogs. After a little prodding one brave H.O.G. member stepped up to the challenge. Though the handler held the dog back, to some extent, he got everything he could handle. He admitted later that the experience was somewhat frightening and yes he could definitely feel the dogs bite as he latched onto him. Just as the demonstration was ending the rain started delaying the bike games. The bike games did go on about an hour later. That evening the People Choice Bike Show was held at Timms H-D followed by a H.O.G. member only party.

On Saturday along with registration a guided ride listed as the Electrifying Ride left from Timms H-D. At noon all the activities moved to the Denver Downs Event Center which was a covered open sided building. Lunch was available from the Barnwood Grill with Life H.O.G. Members eating free. A Michelin Tire Tech had a discussion about their tires. There were games including Biker Bingo followed by prize drawings. The closing ceremonies were held along with many drawings and entertainment by the Eric Scott Band.

The rally personnel had wonderful support of the area business and the area gave those that attended plenty of activities to keep them busy.

# Corpus Christi H.O.G. Chapter 2016 POI Contest

For the fourth year the Corpus Christi H.O.G. Chapter is offering a Points of Interest (POI) contest for our members put together by Bryan Gabbert. Last years' contest involved visiting 40 points in Texas to get a photo to prove the member was at the POI and this year there are 40 different points scattered all over the state. The purpose of the contest is to give our members a chance to get out and ride to areas of the state that they may not have visited in the past.

This year's contest runs from February 15th through July 31, 2016 with all submissions made to the receptionist at Corpus Christi Harley-Davidson no later than the close of business on August 1, 2016. All current Corpus Christi H.O.G. members are eligible and only one entry per member is allowed.

Chapter members participate at their own risk. Corpus Christi H.O.G. and Corpus Christi Harley-Davidson assume no liability. Do not break the law or endanger yourself or others when taking photos. Multiple entries cannot be combined into one entry form.

Pictures will only be accepted that are printed from a computer on photo/plain paper or printed at a Wal-Mart, Walgreens or other professional printing company. Slides or digital files will not be accepted. Photos must be clear, contain the POI, your motorcycle and a copy of a 2016 HOG magazine or 2016 H.O.G. Touring Guide to date the photo. Images must be clear and individual POIs must be legible in submitted prints. Prints that are blurred, fuzzy, illegible or unrecognizable will not count. One unique photo per POI is required. Optionally you, the entrant, can be in the photo if possible but is not mandatory as some members may participate without anyone else present.

The POIs are divided up into four categories. The first is "Two Steppin' Across Texas" consisting of ten dance halls. The second is "Texas Roadside Oddities" which involves finding the ten items. The third category is "National Interest" for 10 National Parks & Forests in Texas as listed on the contest form. The fourth is "Rooms with a Past" involving going to five old and historic hotels. The fifth and last category is "Historic Courthouses" involving five old historic courthouses.

Prizes for participating and turning in the photos before the due date include:

- 5-9 POIs 100 Rider Rewards points
- 10-19 POIs 250 Rider Rewards points
- 20-29 POIs 500 Rider Rewards points
- 30-39 POIs 1,000 Rider Rewards points
- 40 POIs 2,500 Rider Rewards points

For those that collect a minimum of 25 POIs and turn them in before the due date are eligible to be entered into a drawing for a gift card as follows:

- 1st Prize \$500 Corpus Christi H-D Gift Card
- 2nd Prize \$250 Corpus Christi H-D Gift Card
- 3rd Prize \$100 Corpus Christi H-D Gift Card

Submissions must include an itemized inventory of the POIs visited by turning in the list of POIs on the POI form. All photos should be organized in the order listed on the POI list with one photo per POI. All photos should be unbound and not in a photo album. All submissions should be made to the receptionist at CCHD not later than the close of business on August 1, 2016. In the interest of fairness, all decisions by the POI review committee will be considered final.

If you missed or deleted the email about the event with all the POI locations and rules, please send a note to Sherrie Gabbert or one of the Chapter officers. We will make sure you get a copy.

So, if you haven't started and still want to participate, there is time to get some points.

### 2015 ABC's of Touring Results

Each year H.O.G. offers the ABC's of Touring contest to its members as a way to get out and have some fun while riding to collect pictures to document the visit. In 2015 there were 1,672 members in North America that took part. The ABCs patch and pin colors have changed from blue and red in previous years to black and orange. Corpus Christi H.O.G. members noted that participated in 2015 were:

Many of our members have participated in the ABCs over the years where in addition to pins and patches, you earn annual prizes depending on your point levels obtained. Simply keep a camera and a current edition of a 2016 H.O.G. magazine or 2016 Touring Guide on your bike. Then, you earn points by submitting photos of you and your Harley in front of an official sign with a current copy of one of the magazines. You must physically be in 6 photos per year, but your bike, the signs and magazine must be in all. The points are accumulated by getting a photo in front of an official city sign starting with each letter of the alphabet, a county starting with each letter of the alphabet, each US H.O.G. Rally, National Rallies, each state, each country, each Canadian Providence, five National Parks, five National Forests, 10 H-D dealership, each HD Factory, the H-D museum (counts for 2 points), and International Rallies. All photos must be submitted to Milwaukee, WI on the current year form before December 31<sup>st</sup> of the current year.

# **HOG Pin Stops**

Each year H.O.G. has pins stops at rallies and events around the country. Each stop will have a special H.O.G. pin available at each stop of H.O.G. members only. You must lead at least three rides after your training and be approved before you receive your patch. The selection of Road Captains is at the discretion of the Primary Officers and the Head Road Captain.

Being a Road Captain and leading our rides is a big responsibility with rider safety the most important goal. Being at the front of the group having to look down the road, think about what the next turn will be, positioning the group for turns, watching for hazards and making sure we all arrive together is a big task. It is much more stressful leading a group than riding alone and we are fortunate to have a group of members who step up to the plate for each ride.

### **Texas HOG Rally**

The Texas H.O.G. Rally was held in Denison on May 12-14. The Denison/Sherman area is north of Dallas on the Texas and Oklahoma border which is separated by the Red River hence the rally moto was "Rockin' the Red River".

Denison was founded in 1872 in conjunction with the Missouri–Kansas–Texas Railroad (MKT) or "Katy" depot. It was named after the wealthy Katy vice president George Denison and in 1875 Doc Holliday had offices in Denison. In 1901 the first electric "Interurban" railway in Texas, the Denison and Sherman Railway, was completed between Denison and Sherman, Texas. Denison played host to 20th century notables such as the Marx Brothers and President Dwight D. Eisenhower, who was born on October 14, 1890, in Denison.

The rally offered three full days of events beginning on Thursday, May 12. The rally location was the Texoma Event Center. Registration opened bright and early at 8:00am. There were areas for the riding skills practice course for those that wanted to compete in the bike skills games, human foosball practice, and tattoo contest voting along with all the self-guided rides. Guided rides included the Lake Texoma Bridges Guided Ride, Roller Coaster Guided Ride and the Carpenter Bluff Moonshine Run. Afternoon activities included a photo booth, magician walk around, outside area DJ, Ladies bling area and biker bingo. Late afternoon was the human foosball chapter completion followed by the opening ceremonies. The evening entertainment was the Brent Frailicks Band. The Texoma H-D also had a dealership welcome party.

On Friday the activities continued with much of the same activities and guided rides along with added guided rides including the Ida Roads Guide Ride, Snake Strike Guided Ride, Bonnie and Clyde Guided Ride and the LOH Lunch at Angela's Ride. It should be noted that most all rides ended up at a restaurant or some other type of establishment for lunch. Friday night's entertainment was the Déjà Vu Band at Loose Wheels Texas.

Saturday continued most all previous day activities and guided rides. The 903 Brewery Guided ride was added. Bike games were held during the morning. After lunch were the Rider Skills Novice and Rider Skill Advanced Competition. There was also a demonstration by the Kone Killers. The parade of flags was held mid-afternoon and the route covered almost 30 miles. The Chapter competition finals of human foosball were held late in the afternoon. The closing ceremonies and awards were held in downtown Denison at Heritage Park followed by the Saturday Night Street Party with Vince Vance and the Valiants.

Rally Coordinator Patty Langley and her Rally Committee did a fine job putting on a rally for the many H.O.G. members that attended. Next years' Texas H.O.G. rally will be held in the Belton area.

# **National H.O.G. Mileage Recognition**

The National H.O.G. Mileage Recognition program has been in existence since 1995.

Many of our local members participate in this program. The following are members who have attained an award milestone since the 1st quarter 2016 V-Twin newsletter was published. Those listed below are only those who turned in their mileages at Corpus Christi Harley-Davidson. If you mailed yours directly to Milwaukee or recorded the mileage at another dealership, you will not be listed. If we missed you for any reason, we apologize.

If you are not enrolled in the H.O.G. Mileage Recognition program please visit with the receptionist at Corpus Christi Harley-Davidson soon and she will help get you enrolled. Mileages can be accumulated for as long as you are a H.O.G. member and on multiple H-D motorcycles. The main thing to remember is that the mileages can't be reported retroactively, so the sooner you enroll the more miles you can accumulate. Patches, pins and

Maximum reimbursement is \$50.

# **Chapter Meeting Minutes from April**

Corpus Christi H.O.G. Chapter - #5020 Chapter Meeting @ Silverado Smokehouse Monday, April 4, 2016

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM by Dan Robinson, Chapter Director, with 29 members in attendance.

Dan welcomed everyone to the 2nd Quarter of 2016 and then asked if there were any new members in attendance. Rebecca Madison introduced herself as a new member. Dan asked everyone to make sure they signed in. Dan asked if anyone needed Chapter Charity or Chapter Donation drawing tickets.

Daniel Barrientez, Assistant Director, was asked if he had anything for the group and he didn't.

Rickey Thielen said that the Chapter currently had 106 members. He then read the member birthdays and anniversaries for April, May and the first part of June up to the June meeting.

Cyndi Robinson, Treasurer, reported the starting Chapter bank balance as of February was \$1,234.03 with February income of \$295.00 from dues/Chapter Donations less expenses of \$31.84 for an ending balance of \$1,497.19. March 2016 had income of \$122.00 and with no expenses for a March ending balance of \$1,619.19. In April to date we had income of \$168.00 for a balance, as of the start of the meeting, of \$1,787.19.

David Benoist, Head Road Captain, thanked everyone who helped at the CCHD Demo rides.

David then announced the results for the 1st Quarter 2016 Jim Clark Memorial Mileage Contest that had 15 participants. Louis Kubala won with 13,026 miles. Louis received the 1st Quarter Mileage Contest patch and a shirt from Preston Douglass and CCHD. miles, Bryan & Sherrie Gabbert with 6,880 miles, Sabas Cavazos & Alma Villarreal with 6,350 miles, Eric Thomas with 5,206 miles, Julian & Diana Gaona with 4,348 miles, Renato Perez with 3,405 miles, David Benoist with 2,698 miles, Marshall Lester with 2,242 miles, Santos Juarez with 1,356 miles, Dan Robison with 1,111 and Cyndi Robinson with 1,055 miles.

David said that participation the first quarter added up to 82,633 total miles.

David conducted the drawing for the 1st Quarter 2016 Jim Clark Memorial Mileage Contest runners up and Bryan & Sherrie Gabbert won a shirt from Preston Douglass and CCHD.

Eric Thomas, Safety Officer, said he would be giving a safety briefing at each meeting. He said that it was important to have a motorcycle that is safe to ride and it was important to have it serviced regularly. He then talked about the TCLOCS system checklist to make sure your bike is ready to ride. He stressed that this is not needed each time, but should be checked regularly. Since we ride in South Texas, the hot/cold fluctuations affect our bikes. Eric recommends frequent checks and doing the regular manufacturers recommended services. Let him know if anyone needs more detail on TCLOCS.

David Benoist said that the next Road Captain class will be on April 9th at CCHD from 8-12 noon. He would like to get as many current Road Captains as possible to attend. Anyone willing to become a Road Captain should also attend.

Dan Robinson said that Bryan & Sherrie lead the ride to the Goliad Brewing Co. this past weekend and was a nice ride. It took 1-1/4 hours going to just north of Goliad. This would be a nice ride to have again.

Richard Smith said that Bryan & Sherrie Gabbert set up the 40 point POI challenge and that it was the best eight days of his life and that he was done with all 40 points. Great job on their part.

Sherrie Gabbert, Activities Officer, said that the POI challenge runs through July 31 and if anyone needs the information again, please let her know. The lunch rides are getting longer due to the nicer weather. The Wildflower Ride leaves on April 15 and would like to get a list of people who are going to ride up with the group on Friday. She has only heard from a couple people. The ride will leave from the Whataburger by CCHD leaving at 9:00am. The earliest check in time at the motel in Blanco is 2:00pm.

Preston Douglass, Sponsor, said that the Demo rides were great and thanks for all the help. Scott, the H-D Demo truck driver was very pleased with how the Demo rides went. The Harley Happy Hour will be the last Friday of April. The Bikini Party will be May 21. The Happy Hour the last Friday of June will be on the cooler side of the shop.

Someone mentioned that there will be a Cinco de Mayo lunch ride to Laredo to the Los Generales Restaurant followed by a party at Laredo H-D. Preston said that he will check to see who is cooking at Laredo H-D and see what they are doing. He may be able to get us in and out faster for some food at the shop than going to a restaurant. He doesn't know what their plans are but will check and get back to Chapter.

Jim Jessen asked about the progress at the new Laredo H-D shop and Preston said the grand opening should be in late August. The new shop is about the same square feet or slightly smaller than CCHD. There won't be any Demo rides at the grand opening, but may be able to get the Demo truck for November depending on their schedule.

Eric Thomas asked about a booth at shop parties and events to try to boost Chapter membership. Preston said that the Laredo Chapter had hit him up for a tent with backdrop and tables which turned out nice. He would be happy to get one for the CC Chapter and that it would look professional. He also mentioned that the New Bike Buyer Party will be once per year, like Gruene H-D has done, and will try this for a year or two. Richard Smith said that the past Friday and Saturday he rode 1,500 miles. It rained all day Friday along with the wind. He had to make an emergency stop and for the first time experienced the ABS brakes on wet pavement. He recommended that everyone take their bikes out of dry pavement and try the ABS brakes to understand how they react before they actually have to use them. He said it is almost like having no brakes but it works. The key is to make sure you are going in a straight line. He said it was definitely a WOW factor, but a good one.

Preston said that when ABS brakes came out he saw a demo of them on gravel. The bike being demonstrated had outriggers and the demo rider would show the difference of using the brakes on gravel with and without the ABS. One thing you have to get used to is the vibration and to not panic releasing the brakes. H-D has expanded the ABS brakes to more and more models over the years. ABS on the touring bikes first came out in 2008. At first you could only get ABS as an option, and then they started being installed on many more models. A tip is that the yellow light stays on until you reach a certain speed. Preston then talked about an incident at the shop involving one of his maintenance techs who installed the bearing backwards affecting the ABS on a bike he had worked on. He couldn't get the ABS light to go off due to the bearing being on backwards.

Dan asked if there was any other business and there was none.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:42 PM. Thanks to all those in attendance.

## **Chapter Meeting Minutes from June**

Corpus Christi H.O.G. Chapter - #5020 Chapter Meeting @ Silverado Smokehouse Monday, June 6, 2016

The meeting was called to order at 7:02 PM by Dan Robinson, Chapter Director, with 36 members in attendance.

Dan welcomed everyone to the meeting, asked if there were any new members in attendance and there were none. Dan asked everyone to make sure they signed in.

Jerry Olivarez, Chaplain, gave the opening prayer.

Dan asked if anyone needed Chapter donation drawing tickets.

Linda Benavides asked about what the Chapter charity was for this year. Is it the Coastal Bend Troop Support, Halo Flight or the Women's Shelter? A discussion started about the charities mentioned and questioned whether Halo Flight was a 501C organization. Halo Flights offers individual memberships for \$25 per year or \$45 for two years. Family members and dependents living in the household are included on each membership with coverage of the Coastal Bend, San Antonio and Dallas.

John Lackey made a motion to keep the Coastal Bend Troop Support as our charity which was seconded by David Benoist. Dan asked for a showing of hands and the Coastal Bend Troop Support was chosen as our charity for 2016.

Daniel Barrientez, Assistant Director, said he had taken a trip for the Rolling Thunder in Washington, DC. He thanked those that went and said he would do the trip next year. He talked about the National Veterans Riders.

Rickey Thielen said that the Chapter currently had 108 members. He then read the member birthdays and anniversaries for June and July. He said that the 25th Annual Ride to Work Day will be held on June 20th and has been on the 3rd Monday of June since it started. The Ride to Work Day was started to make motorcyclists visible to the public and politicians, show that we come from all walks of life, show they can reduce traffic and parking in congested large cities, be a form of transportation as well as for recreation and that motorcycling is a social good.

Cyndi Robinson, Treasurer, is out recovering from knee replacement surgery so Rickey Thielen gave the Treasurers report. As of the April meeting the bank balance was \$1,787.19 with income of \$94.50 and expenses of \$117.42 for an April ending balance of \$1,764.27. There was no change in May. There was income of \$24.00 from dues and the balance at the time of the meeting was \$1,788.27.

Eric Thomas, Safety Officer, said that there are three areas of bike safety. He talked about things that affect our bikes at the last meeting. For this meeting he wanted to talk about what affects the rider which is personal safety equipment (PPE). Items include boots, jackets, long pants, and gloves. Some of our members wear teeshirts only and some wear padded jackets. Consider wearing jackets for protection against road rash should an accident occur. He then talked about the accident two weeks back on a Sunday breakfast ride to Caroline's in Holiday Beach. As the group was going down FM 1069 two large dogs came through a gap in a fence and headed for the group. Richard Smith was leading and Bryan & Sherrie Gabbert were second. The dog missed

the first two bikes, but made impact with Eric in the 3rd position. He quickly thought was about needing to keep control of his bike as to not impact the rest of the riders. He braced himself by stiffening his arms and maintained a straight track. The dog hit him on the left side between the front wheel and the lower fairing. The dog was killed instantly. The impact bent his engine guard around into the left floor board making him unable to shift the bike. He was able to bring the bike to a stop safely.

Eric talked about the Billy Edward's Law Firm and some information that had put out. They said in areas that you can't see well, like around curves, the best thing to do is increase the spacing between you and the other riders.

David Benoist, Head Road Captain, said that the end of the quarter for the local chapter mileage contest is on June 30th and is a Thursday. Get your mileage to Rickey Thielen, Dan Robinson or himself. David said that miles are important. David then talked about the National Mileage Program and how he had 37,000 miles on his first bike but had never enrolled in the program, so those miles were lost. He bought his next bike and enrolled in the program and he is now at 100,000 miles. He received a nice medallion for his bike along with the 100,000 mile rocker.

Sherrie Gabbert, Activities Officer, was on a trip. Linda Benavides said that the Chapter POI Challenge is still going on through August 1st and requires your bike, a 2016 HOG or Touring magazine cover and the POI in the picture. She said the 3rd quarter events calendar will be coming out soon. Sherrie wanted for the Chapter to pick a theme for the Christmas Party. Last year was a Country Western theme with a casino. The CCPOA hall has been reserved again for this year.

Preston Douglass, Sponsor, said that service appointments can be scheduled through the CCHD website. He talked about how they have a suggestion area on the website. They recently got an interesting suggestion which was to have an ejection seat or cocoon, like on a jet fighter, to protect the rider in the case of an accident with comfortable seats. The person also recommended having a flare go off to mark the spot. In addition the person recommended building solar powered bikes. It was obvious that this person put a lot of thought into these ideas.

Preston said there will be a Happy Hour at the end of June. He went on to discuss that Harley-Davidson has three types of Harley shops. There is the full retail store like CCHD, SLRs or satellite store that sells motorcycles and has motor clothes (like Laredo was) and AROs or alternate retail stores that only sell merchandise like in the airports or on the San Antonio Riverwalk. He has always wanted an ARO in Port Aransas, but the H-D Motor Company would not let him open one until the new Laredo shop was well under construction. He will be opening a shop in Port Aransas near Bernie's Beach House by the end of July this year and it will be called Wahoo Harley-Davidson. He also said the new Laredo shop will be open after Labor Day this year.

Daniel Barrientez said that he had a tire replaced at Smokin' H-D in Winston-Salem, NC that had a restaurant next to the shop. He was given beer and snacks while they were waiting for the tire to be replaced. Daniel asked Preston why the shop doesn't sell beer on the property. Preston replied that he has served beer on occasion for events but used one of the vendor's licenses to offer the beer. He will not pursue beer sales at the dealership.

Preston said that he enjoyed seeing the pics on Facebook of the trip members took to the Rolling Thunder event in DC and other rides. He said that this Chapter has a lot of members who really ride from the Thielen's who will ride to Oklahoma for piece of pie and Louis Kubala who just rides the tires off his bike. Preston said the Laredo Chapter rides a lot but just won't leave the Laredo city limits. He talked about years ago trying to get

the Laredo Chapter to take an overnight trip to Corpus Christi to see a CC IceRays vs Laredo Bucks hockey game. This was back when the Coliseum was still the site of the hockey games. He had arranged a premium place to stay in Corpus Christi along with special hockey game tickets. He left the Laredo shop with 18 bikes and by the time they reached the Laredo city limits they had lost some bikes. Then before they got to the Border Patrol checkpoint he lost all but 4 bikes.

Linda Benavides said the when they did the Texas Iron Ass ride, which was a circle to nowhere, the Laredo members where extremely hospitable. Before she left the Laredo shop they came over and shook everyone's hand. Preston said that Laredo has an awesome Fajita Cook Off the same time that CCHD has their Chili Cook-Off. One year the Laredo Chapter rode to their shop for the Cook-Off and tied their bikes up with pink reins saying they were the Brokeback Mountain MC.

Preston was asked about the Riders Rewards and the double point days. He said he had to change it up as it was getting stale. Statistically they are giving away more points under the new system than before. You have to be on the CCHD Facebook page to get the notices of what days are double points and it is only announced a day in advance.

Eric Thomas asked Preston about possible discounts for veterans. Preston replied that he needed to be careful about how this or any discount is used. He had been thinking about something along these lines for some time. There are no Harley-Davidson supported veterans' type benefits currently available. If he did have a program he would want to know that the person that was entitled to the benefit was the one using it.

Preston was asked if he thought the Motor Company would come out with a new 115 CI motor during the next anniversary in 2018. He said that they have introduced a new motor before during one of the previous anniversaries, but didn't know of anything being talked about. He said the new Low Rider S bike with the 110 CI engine is unbelievable.

The Chapter donation drawing brought in \$130.00 and was won by Jerry Olivarez who received \$65.00. The Chapter charity drawing was won by Richard Smith and he will receive a gift from Preston Douglass and CCHD.

Linda Benavides asked about what the Christmas Party theme was going to be as we didn't decide anything. Dan asked everyone to think about it for the next meeting in August. The question came up about whether we were going to have any fund raising events this year like a bake sale. Nothing was resolved on this issue.

Dan reminded everyone to get their mileages turned in for the mileage contest by the end of the month. He then asked if there was any other business and there was none.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:56 PM. Thanks to all those in attendance.
